

TE REO PĀKEHA

This term tauira will be working on developing their writing, speaking and presenting skills. Tauira will conclude the term with an end of unit speech on a topic of their choice which will be a minimum of 3 minutes long. There will also be an end of year examination in week 4 which will test a range of skills including reading, writing and comprehension. This test will cover skills also taught in previous terms this year.

TĪKANGA-Ā-IWI

This term will be spent summarising the differences in world views as we compare our indigenous world view with those of the western world in terms of history. This exercise will also give our tauira an opportunity to practice their report writing skills, as well as their knowledge on what we have learnt about this year. There will be an end of year examination in week 4.

ΡŪΤΑΙΑΟ

Tauira will be cover planet earth and beyond this term and will also revise content covered in term 3. The planet earth and beyond unit in year 9 focuses on physics principles which underpin the motion of planets, the sun and the moon. They will also expand on this and learn about the vast expanse of the universe and the various components which make up our universe including blackholes, constellations (star systems), dark matter, meteors, comets and galaxies. They will be examined in week 4 of this term which will cover the scientific method, report writing, fair testing, electricity and planet earth and beyond. This will consolidate their learning for the second half of the year.
